She was external examiner for the evaluation of the museological study conducted by the museologists M. Ferris, S. Revell and M. Chrissafi on the development of the Cultural Centre of the Foundation of Meizonos Hellenism (IME) and the planning of a new museum, in Athens (2000).

Since I997 Irene Nakou has been working with Amy Bartow-Melia, Deputy Associate Director for Public Programs, of the National Museum of American History, Kenneth E. Behring Center, Smithsonian Institution (Washington), in the planning of educational programmes for children and in organizing relevant exhibitions, especially for the London International Gallery of Children's Art and the Children International Art Organization (CIAO), of which they are both members.
